British Cattle Movement Service Tracing System- CattleKeepers need to continue to record movements to showgrounds in the passport itself and in farm records. This show can provide barcode labels giving the required details of the event for use in the movement summary of the Cattle Passport.

Cows or Heifers entered in calf can be shown in the in-milk class; proof must be given that same has calved after entry was made.

Name of animal not required on entry form.

Exhibitors must be members of the Shorthorn Society of the UK and Ireland. All cattle must be registered in the Coates' Herd Book or when coming from another Member State an officially approved herd book in that member state, be of Shorthorn colour and contain a minimum of 25% Shorthorn blood.

Calving Index. 2 points will be added for every day under 400, and 2 points deducted for every day over.

A NMR Certificate, Cow Record Page or other official statement showing 1. Date of calving, 2. Number of Lactation, 3. Quality of Milk, 4. Number of days in milk, and 5. Average per cent of butterfat yielded in not more than 305 days of the last completed lactation must be submitted with the entry form for each lactation (An animal in milk at the time of entry and likely to complete her lactation before the Show will not be eligible to compete on that lactation, but will be eligible on her previous lactation).
